# Spring 2023 Cohort - Feedback about in person vs. online sessions - Preferences? Barriers?

- Pamika Agency appreciates in person because it feels more engaging to share ideas, for participants joining online trainings at work there were a lot of distractions.
- Valerie Only had one person to do it online and they prefer the in-person experience, online is nice if you have at least one other person from your agency to connect with outside of the zooms.
- Alexandra Staff felt like there was a lot of homework and finding time to do the online work was more difficult than blocking off a whole day for in person training.
- Natasha Staff tend to like in-person and actually receive the information better. No distractions and more engaging.

# **Current HV Agency Work Models**

• Stephanie – Doing hybrid model. Agency working from home but starting to do monthly team meetings, training, etc. in person.



- Natasha Doing 100% in person with some tele-health. Clients actually are preferring in-person vs virtual and would be open to attending the sessions.
- Valerie Just started going back in the homes in September but have had lots of cancellations due to RSV/Covid.

## Website & Mobile App Feedback

- Overview of website home page and video library.
- Natasha In favor of the app. Convenient to have everything at fingertips when supporting a team member (Remembers accessing MI/EPE approach and examples).
- Eboni It would be helpful to put the app on the tablet with Maxwell but there is not an internet connection easily accessible in many family's homes.
- Dona Maxwell is thriving. In the process of renewing contract, HFA standards are now integrated. Sites are no longer using the tablets. Data was not attached to it.
- Laurencia asked about app analytics but the reports are very limited/primitive but we can refer back to previous reports.

- Pamika Baltimore Healthy Start also interested. Current grant focuses on this population with Total Health Care and interested in either online OR in person.

# Future Training needs and support from the training center?

• Stephanie - Would love anything related to partnering with teen parents. Parents as Teachers used to offer a 3-day training along with a great standalone



curriculum, but hasn't offered any training sessions since COVID, so she's looking for something for her home visitors.

- Alexandra Trainings that help encourage father engagement, they work with Afghani fathers so there is a cultural piece as well, (connecting with Jarvis via Laurencia). Alex is also interested in goal setting which would jive well with new data system. Serves Montgomery and Prince George's counties.
- Pamika Interested in compassion and fatigue, staff retention. Could be helpful for her group.
- Natasha Phyllis did a training on self-care or compassion fatigue and it was very well received by home visitors. It was very engaging and necessary.

# MDH Update

- Laurencia started at the end of June as program manager for MIECHV
  Previously taught health education at Towson University
- Lots of crisis management the past few months.
- Current MIECHV grant set to expire next week but reauthorization just passed through the house.
- Received feedback from procurement currently reviewing the statement of work.
- The goal is to post RFA end of January.
- Hoping to look more at social determinants of health like HS/GED completion.
- Data submission has gotten better. Ensure equity and inclusion plan to collect HV data to inform recruitment and retention efforts.

- Turnover = progression? How to support career trajectories.
- What about a HV certification program?
