 - Nicole great idea, when/how will we do this?

Mary -Update on Fatherhood project (led by Jarvis). They have a couple of fatherhood contracts for the next 2 years.

- Focus on how do we engage fathers more?

- Individuals leading are dads and mostly from the communities and populations they serve. Good opportunity for engagement.

MDH update -

- Tasked with needs assessment, received some great information and has new initiatives in the works she can't talk about yet
